Invitation to „Integrated Urban Management in Practice“

1st Joint Workshop by Rapid Planning Project and GIZ

The BMBF Research and Development Project „*Rapid Planning*“ and the GIZ Sector Project „*Sustainable Development of Metropolitan Regions*“ cordially invite you to take part in the 1st joint workshop event presenting trans-sectoral approaches and implementation activities for integrated urban management. The workshop addresses municipal decision makers, practitioners in the field of international development cooperation, and urban researchers and experts involved in urban infrastructure planning. The workshop format of a World Café will give the opportunity to learn about the activities which will be presented by means of practical experiences from the BMBF project cities Da Nang (Vietnam), Kigali (Rwanda) and Frankfurt (Germany) as well as the GIZ-project city Dar es Salaam (Tanzania). The vivid table discussions will be captured by facilitators and presented to the audience during the wrap-up sessions.

Rapid Planning is an action and user oriented joint research project that seeks to develop and test a rapid trans-sectoral urban planning methodology with focus on urban basic services infrastructure, specifically targeting supply and disposal infrastructure in highly dynamic metropolises. The purpose is to aid the identification and harnessing of synergies between the individual supply and disposal sectors to achieve mutually reinforcing solutions that are both cost and resource efficient. The Rapid Planning approach which is essentially based on methodologies for gathering reliable data, is supposed to be finally applicable in different social, political and economic contexts. Tangible products de-

veloped by the Rapid Planning Project will include an urban data warehouse on urban infrastructure planning data, knowledge blocks on a variety of related topics, computer-aided tools for trans-sectoral modelling and a guideline and roadmap for the Rapid Planning implementation.

The GIZ Sector Project „Sustainable Development of Metropolitan Regions“ develops implementation-oriented approaches to the promotion of sustainable development of urban and metropolitan areas. Through international cooperation networks, the project addresses development policy for city-regional action and pilot projects for the development and implementation of solutions for integrated urban management.

With the Urban Nexus approach, the project aims at anchoring integrated resource management as a guiding principle for sustainable urban and regional development. The project supports local decision makers in partner countries of the German Development Cooperation to develop solutions across sectorial and spatial mandates in order to improve the water, energy and food security in cities, as well as interdependencies between these sectors in terms of efficient use of resources. To this end, stakeholders from different sectors, levels of government and institutions create synergies and identify trade-offs in resource use at an early stage of planning. Through this integrated approach, the German Development Cooperation facilitates stronger policy coherence in urban planning.

From airport to FRA-UAS:

Go to Airport Regional Train Station, take S-Bahn lines S8 or S9 to „Konstablerwache“. Change to bus line 30 (northbound: direction „Bad Vilbel/Friedberger Warte“), or to tram line 18 („Straßenbahn 18“) northbound, direction „Preungesheim/Gravensteiner Platz“ and exit at bus stop „Nibelungenplatz/FH“.

From central station to FRA-UAS:

Take any S-Bahn line to Konstablerwache. Change to bus line 30 (northbound: direction „Bad Vilbel/Friedberger Warte“), or to tram line 18 („Straßenbahn 18“) northbound, direction „Preungesheim/Gravensteiner Platz“ and exit at bus stop „Nibelungenplatz/FH“.

From „Lokalbahnhof“ or „Konstablerwache“ station to FRA-UAS:

Take the tram line 18 („Straßenbahn 18“) northbound, direction „Preungesheim/Gravensteiner Platz“. Exit at „Nibelungenplatz/FH“.

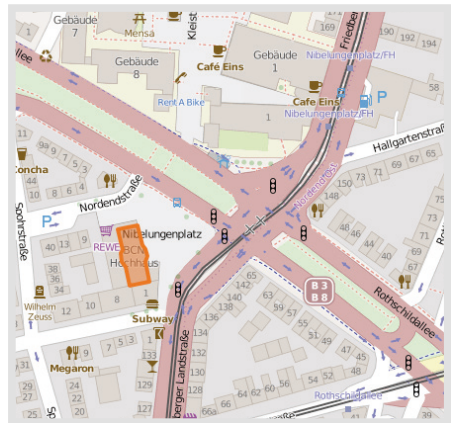
